Resident applicants must have obtained a doctorate degree from an APA or CPA-accredited program and an APA or CPA-accredited clinical internship. The program prefers candidates with doctoral degrees in clinical psychology or clinical neuropsychology, but applicants with degrees in counseling psychology, medical psychology, or behavioral medicine with education and experience in neuropsychology may also be considered. Applications from individuals whose training programs are not accredited at the time of application are not accepted. Preferred applicants completed training at the graduate and internship level consistent with a Major Area of Study in Clinical Neuropsychology. As part of the application packet, APPCN's doctoral training verification form completed by the Director of Training at the applicant's doctoral program stating that all requirements for graduation, including dissertation, will be completed prior to the start date of the residency program is required. Applicants who are not U.S. citizens must have unrestricted authorization to work in the U.S. for the full two-year residency program before their application can be accepted. Applicants must confirm their citizenship/visa status in their letter of interest. We are an equal opportunity program and encourage applications from all qualified individuals regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, disability, or other minority status.

The program offers a Major Area of Study in Clinical Neuropsychology, is APA-accredited, an APPCN-member (www.appcn.org), and adheres to the Houston Conference Guidelines. Graduates of this program are expected to be eligible for (and are encouraged to complete) specialty certification by the American Board of Clinical Neuropsychology. The program offers two tracks of training: 1) general clinical neuropsychology and 2) neuropsychological rehabilitation. Preferred applicants will have prior training experiences and career goals that are in alignment with the track to which they are applying. All residents have a minimum of 10% protected research time and are eligible for partial financial assistance to attend one scientific conference per year. Residents also participate in a comprehensive didactic series and interdisciplinary case conferences.
