Naomi Salins, MD

Dr. Salins is a faculty physician in the Movement Disorders Program at Barrow Neurological Institute. She is board certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and serves as an active member of the American Academy of Neurology and the Movement Disorder Society. Dr. Salins' expertise includes the diagnosis and treatment of Essential Tremor, Parkinson's disease, Dystonia,

Huntington's disease, involuntary movements and ataxia.



Francisco A. Ponce, MD

Dr. Ponce was named the director of the new Barrow Center for Neuromodulation in 2011 and is the highest volume DBS surgeon in the country. Dr. Ponce earned his undergraduate degree in physics at Harvard. After attending graduate school at Oxford, he went on to complete medical school at the University of Chicago. He completed his residency in neurological surgery at Barrow Neurological Institute,

and received subspecialty training in Stereotactic and Functional Neurosurgery at the University of Toronto under Dr. Andres Lozano. He is board certified by the American Academy of Neurological Surgeons and serves as the Director of the Barrow Neurosurgery Residency Program.



Alexander Tröster, PhD

Dr. Tröster is a Professor and Chair of the Department of Clinical Neuropsychology at Barrow Neurological Institute. He is a fellow of the American Psychological Association and the National Academy of Neuropsychology and the former President of the National Academy of Neuropsychology. Dr. Tröster's expertise includes the neuropsychological evaluation of persons with movement disorders,

especially those persons undergoing neuromodulation (deep brain stimulation) and other stereotactic and functional neurosurgical procedures.



Tom Scheub, OTR

Tom is an Occupational Therapist at Barrow Neurological Institute. He received his Bachelor of Science in Occupational Therapy from Midwestern University and is certified in LSVT BIG for Parkinson's disease. Tom specializes in the treatment of individuals with movement disorders and tremors.
