

10 MUST-SEE ATTRACTIONS



1. CAMELBACK MOUNTAIN

Nearly every outdoors-loving Phoenix local has, at some time or another, started their day with a hike to the top of Camelback Mountain. The city's most famous landmark resembles a dromedary camel in repose, and the mountain challenges hikers with a rugged but rewarding trek to its 2,700-foot "hump."

2. MUSICAL INSTRUMENT MUSEUM

This museum is the first in the world dedicated to the celebration of global instruments. The collection includes instruments from more than 200 countries and territories. Musicians of all ages will dig the Experience Gallery, where you can touch and play every instrument on display.

3. DESERT BOTANICAL GARDEN

This outdoor museum showcases desert plants — and not just those native to the Southwest. Among the succulents that adorn the garden's 55 cultivated acres are Dali-esque trees from North Africa and sprawling cacti from Mesopotamia. Pro tip: Sign up for a docent-guided tour.

4. HEARD MUSEUM

The traditional and contemporary art on display at the Heard provides insight into the culture of Arizona's 22 Native American tribes. Not to be missed is the upstairs exhibit on Indian boarding schools. And the Heard Museum Shop is one of best places in Phoenix to buy authentic American Indian art and jewelry.

5. CHILDREN'S MUSEUM OF PHOENIX

This museum doesn't focus on art or science, nor does it contain paintings or bones. Instead, the hands-on exhibits are designed simply to entertain children as young as infants and as old as 10. (Don't miss the hanging forest of pool noodles.)

6. SOUTH MOUNTAIN PARK AND PRESERVE

This is one of the largest municipal parks in the U.S. It covers 16,000 acres, making it nearly 20 times larger than Central Park in New York. But you won't find manicured grass and fountains here; the park is instead filled with native flora, ancient petroglyphs and 50-plus miles of trails. There's also a kid-friendly nature center and a paved road to the summit.

7. PHOENIX ART MUSEUM

Phoenix Art Museum is the largest fine-art museum in the Southwest. Its permanent collection includes American, Asian and European masterpieces. The museum is noted for its Western American collection, but striking work is also to be found in the contemporary wing and fashion-design gallery.

8. HERITAGE SQUARE

Occupying a city block in downtown Phoenix, Heritage Square is a link to the city's 19th-century origins. Heritage Square is home to preserved Victorian-style homes, as well as the dramatically modern Arizona Science Center. Go for the critically acclaimed food at Pizzeria Bianco and Nobuo at Teeter House, stay for the history.

9. OLD TOWN SCOTTSDALE

The Old West and New West converge in Old Town Scottsdale, where galleries dedicated to American Indian and cowboy arts share a pedestrian-friendly streetscape with shops that sell Southwestern jewelry and crafts. You'll also find some of Greater Phoenix's finest restaurants and trendiest nightlife.

10. TALIESIN WEST

Subtly rising out of the desert floor at the foot of the McDowell Mountains, Taliesin West was the winter home of Frank Lloyd Wright, America's most-famous architect. Tours of this UNESCO World Heritage Site take place year-round.

PHOENIX SKY HARBOR INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT



Phoenix is home to one of the most accessible, affordable and welcoming major airports in the United States. Here's why:

- The City of Phoenix is in the midst of investing more than \$1.2 billion over a three-year period on airport renovations and improvements, this includes:
 - Complete modernization of Terminal 3, to include consolidated security checkpoint; additional ticket counters, gates and baggage claim carousels; increase in baggage processing capacity; and new and renovated retail, concessions and restaurants (2020).
 - PHX Sky Train's 2.5-mile extension to the Rental Car Center (2022).
 - Expansion of Terminal 4, including international facility improvements, a new eight-gate concourse for Southwest Airlines; the addition of two connector bridges, one across Sky Harbor Boulevard and one accessing the D concourse (2022).
 - The demolition of Terminal 2 (2020).
- Sky Harbor is served by 18 carriers and is a hub for two major airlines: American and Southwest.
- Centrally located, Sky Harbor is less than four miles from downtown Phoenix and within 30 minutes of most hotels and resorts.
- The airport is home to the Navigators, a group of cheerful volunteers who are devoted to ensuring all passengers at Sky Harbor have a positive experience. You can find them wearing a bright purple shirt and a smile.

RANKINGS & AWARDS

- In 2020, Sky Harbor earned the top spot in J.D. Power's North America Airport Satisfaction Study in the mega airport category.
- In 2020, Sky Harbor's PHX Sky Train project earned an Envision Gold Award for sustainability from the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure.
- When measured against the 40 largest American airports, Sky Harbor came in at No. 1, according to *The Wall Street Journal's* 2019 U.S. Airport Rankings.
- ThePointsGuy.com rated Sky Harbor the No. 1 and No. 2 airport in the nation for 2018 and 2019, respectively.
- Sky Harbor was ranked No. 1 in the U.S. for shopping in *USA Today's* 10 Best Travel Contest in 2019 and, in 2018, landed at No. 3 among most dog-friendly airport in the country rankings by both UpgradedPoints.com and ThePointsGuy.com.

PHOENIX AIRLIFT

- On a typical day more than 1,200 aircraft and more than 120,000 passengers arrive and depart Sky Harbor International Airport. In 2018, Sky Harbor served more than 44.9 million passengers.
- Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport ranked 12th in OAG's 2019 U.S. Domestic Megahubs Index, ranking the airport as one of the most connected in the U.S. for domestic services.
- The average domestic airfare to/from Sky Harbor has been lower than the national average since 1995, according to the U.S. Bureau of Transportation.
- Sky Harbor continues to expand international flight offerings. In 2019, direct flights were expanded to:
 - Frankfurt, Germany
 - London, England
 - Chihuahua, Mexico (December 2019)

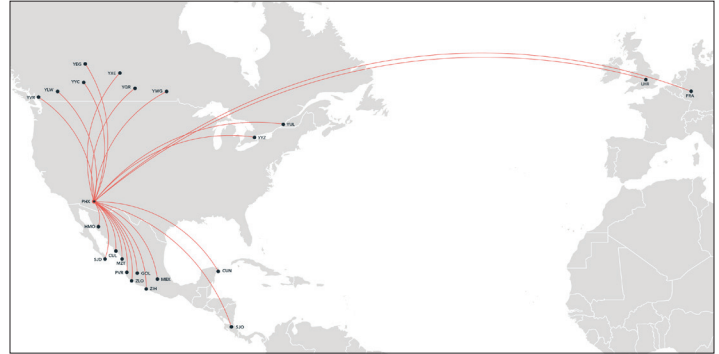

WHEN YOU ARRIVE



Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport is located less than four miles from downtown Phoenix, and arriving passengers, in groups of all sizes, have a variety of affordable and convenient transportation options.

PHX SKY TRAIN®

The PHX Sky Train® is an automated train that moves travelers between the airport's busiest terminals and the nearest Valley Metro Rail station (five minutes from Terminal 4). This service is free and operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

VALLEY METRO RAIL

With 38 stations, and trains arriving every 10 minutes, the Valley Metro Rail moves the masses in a hurry. The 28-mile system carries riders to hotels, restaurants, museums and sports arenas in Phoenix, and also the nearby cities of Mesa and Tempe. Passes (one-way, \$2; all-day, \$4) can be purchased at ticketing machines located at each station.

TAXIS

Greater Phoenix has some of the most affordable taxi services in the nation. The typical fare from the airport to downtown is \$17. The following taxis are contracted to pick up passengers at Sky Harbor:

RIDE SHARE

Passengers arriving at Sky Harbor can use ride-sharing services, such as Uber and Lyft, for airport pickup. Drivers with ground-transportation permits will meet passengers in the specified ride-share pickup area outside baggage claim.

CAR RENTALS

Sky Harbor's Rental Car Center makes car rental quick and easy. The spacious facility houses 14 rental car companies and provides a shuttle bus for all customers to and from the airport's terminals. PHX Sky Train® expansion will transport riders directly to the Rental Car Center beginning in 2022.

LIMOUSINES

Several private limousine carriers offer airport-to-door service to and from Sky Harbor. Rates are set according to the address in a given zone for the first two passengers (additional fees apply for three or more passengers).
